

Georgetown French Market Returns April 29 – May 1

The 19th annual springtime open-air market will feature sidewalk sales from 25+ small businesses, food, strolling performers, and music.

Washington, D.C. (March 31, 2022) – The 19th annual Georgetown French Market is a D.C. tradition that marks the arrival of spring. The Georgetown Business Improvement District (BID) announces that the popular festival weekend - perfect for shoppers, foodies and families - will return Friday, April 29 and Saturday, April 30 from 10 am - 5 pm, and Sunday, May 1 from Noon - 5 pm. The free event will be located along Wisconsin Avenue between O Street and Reservoir Road in the Book Hill section of Georgetown, with temporarily widened sidewalks for a more comfortable visitor experience.

More than 25 neighborhood boutiques, antique stores, restaurants, salons and galleries will display their discounted wares for up to 75% off at the inviting open-air market, originally inspired by the outdoor markets in France. Neighborhood restaurants will also offer food and drink specials featuring French cuisine and beyond – from pastries, croissants, and macarons, to grilled lunch items and wine discounts.
