About the Survey

- The survey was distributed through BID channels, ANC, CAG, and neighborhood stakeholders
- The survey was open for 5 weeks
- This survey was not scientific participants self-selected




Satisfaction rate of <u>visitor</u> respondents

Of **visitors**, 83% are either satisfied or very satisfied

- 7% are dissatisfied
- 6% are very dissatisfied

Overall, how satisfied are you with Georgetown's streatery and sidewalk extensions program? (visitors)






Satisfaction rate of <u>resident</u> respondents

Overall, how satisfied are you with Georgetown's streatery and sidewalk extensions program? (residents)






A large majority of <u>visitors</u> want to see the streateries continue, with a smaller majority also supporting sidewalk extensions

- 82% would like to see the <u>streateries</u> continue




A large majority of <u>residents</u> want to see the streateries continue, with a smaller majority also supporting sidewalk extensions




The majority of <u>visitors</u> agree that streateries and sidewalks extensions enhance the public realm and encourage spending more time in Georgetown




The majority of <u>residents</u> agree that streateries and sidewalk extensions enhance the public realm and encourage spending more time in Georgetown




When considering impacts to transportation, most <u>visitors</u> were neutral and do not think transportation has gotten significantly better or worse

Visitor responses:

- 94% were neutral or agree that access to the bus is easier
- 94% were neutral or agree that waiting for the bus is more comfortable
- 97% were neutral or agree that parking their bike or scooter is easier
- 50% were neutral that driving in Georgetown is easier
- 51% were neutral that parking in Georgetown is easier
- 53% were neutral that taking rideshare is easier
- 84% were neutral or agreed that scooters and bikes should have dedicated parking

Thinking about your experience with transportation to and from Georgetown over the past two years, please indicate whether you agree or disagree with the following statements:






When considering impacts to transportation, most <u>residents</u> were neutral and do not think transportation has gotten significantly worse

Georgetown Resident responses:


- 76% were neutral or agree that access to the bus is easier

- 80% were neutral or agree that parking their bike or scooter is easier
- 51% disagreed that driving in Georgetown is easier
- 52% disagreed that parking in Georgetown is easier
- 64% were neutral or agreed that taking rideshare is easier
- 83% were neutral or agreed that scooters and bikes should have dedicated parking

Summary of open-ended comments:


- Add color, lighting, landscaping, and more flexibility for each restaurant (furnishings, plantings, etc.)

When considering the impact on quality of life, <u>visitors</u> believe that both the sidewalk extensions and the streateries have a positive impact


- 83% of visitors think the <u>streateries</u> have a positive impact

What is your overall view of Georgetown's **sidewalk extension** (not the outdoor dining) program on the quality of life in the neighborhood?







When considering the impact on quality of life, <u>residents</u> believe that both the sidewalk extensions and the streateries have a positive impact

of life in the neighborhood?






Business Survey Summary Stats

Total Participants: 92 (represents ~19% of all street-facing businesses)

- 45% retailers
- 37% restaurants
- 8% office tenants
- 7% service providers
- 4% other

Types of Businesses that Responded



- 73% of <u>restaurants</u> think the program has been positive for the neighborhood
- 51% of **retailers** think the program has been positive for the neighborhood

What impact have the streateries and sidewalk extensions had on the business environment?






- 70% of <u>restaurants</u> think the impact of the streateries and sidewalk extensions has been positive for their business
 - 15% think the impact has been negative
- 49% of <u>retailers</u> think the impact of the streateries and sidewalk extensions has been positive for their business
 - 29% think the impact has been negative



- 67% of <u>restaurants</u> have received positive feedback
 - 10% have received negative feedback
- 46% of <u>retailers</u> have received positive feedback
 - 17% have received negative feedback

What feedback have you received from customers?






50% of respondents say it's easier to park and load, have no feedback or have not experienced any change in the ability to park and load

- 39% of all businesses have heard it's harder to park and load from delivery vendors
 - 33% of <u>restaurants</u> have heard it's harder to park and load from delivery vendors
 - 35% of <u>retailers</u> have heard it's harder to park and load from delivery vendors

What feedback have you received from delivery vendors?




- Harder to park and load

How have the sidewalk extensions and streateries impacted deliveries and pick-ups at your business?




- Delivery vendors are charging me more because of them
- I have lost delivery vendors because they had a harder time accessing my business
- I have had a difficult time managing carry-out and pick-up vendors due to the sidewalk extensions

- Individual concerns include:
 - Appointment-based businesses having cancellations due to difficulty parking
 - Carry-out vendors have difficulty finding parking spaces

66% of restaurants invested in additional restaurant equipment or furniture

40% of all businesses say they have experienced either a slight or significant increase in foot traffic as compared to 2019

All Businesses:

- 40% experienced an uptick in foot traffic
- 32% experienced decrease in foot traffic


Restaurants:

- 40% experienced an uptick in foot traffic
- 27% were not open in 2019
- 14% experienced decrease in foot traffic

Retailers:

- 36% experienced an uptick in foot traffic
- 33% experienced decrease in foot traffic
- 18% were not open in 2019
